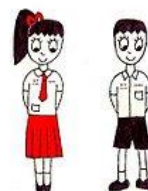
## UNIFORM SHOP

### CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

#### Four Steps to Problem-Solving Success






Hopefully by now you are becoming more conscious of situations at home in which you have the opportunity to help teach problem-solving to your children. The steps you can take to help your children master problem-solving involve four questions you can ask:

1. **What have you done to fix the problem?** Your child will quickly learn that before coming to you, they will need to try something first to fix the problem.
2. **"Did that work?"** Your child can reflect on what went wrong and what went well. So even if your child chose to hit for instance, thankfully the end result is often not good so your child will quickly learn that the wrong behaviours are not the best choices.
3. **"What else could you try?"** See if your child can give you some ideas. You could suggest a solution from another problem that might be useful to consider.
4. If your child is still struggling with the situation after trying something else, you should now offer your help.

Ask **"How would you like me to help?"** By phrasing your question this way, you are still placing responsibility on your child but providing assistance when needed. And don't forget to talk with your children regularly. You might need to point out that they actually solved a problem on their own! It would make for a great dinner table conversation, where others in the family can learn and listen as well. The more you talk about it, the more you reinforce it. Give praises and rewards too if you feel that will help! Good luck! **BRIANNE BURN, CHAPLAIN**
