### New local intake secondary school

The State Government has announced its decision to build a new local intake secondary school, Inner City College (planning name), on Kitchener Park in Subiaco. The inner city has been identified as the best location for a new school as it is at the heart of the population growth in this area. The new school will have world class facilities for students from Years 7 to 12 and be built for 2000 students to ease student enrolment pressures at several schools in the inner and western suburbs. Inner City College will also have a Gifted and Talented academic program. The announcement means the local intake areas for Churchlands Senior High School, Mount Lawley Senior High School and Shenton College have been amended to create a local intake area for the new Inner City College. These will be released shortly and will come into effect from the start of 2020 when Inner City College opens with its first cohort of Year 7 students.

I would like to reassure you that if your child is enrolled at their local secondary school in 2019, they will be able to complete their schooling there. They will not have to change schools. Additionally, if you currently live within a school's local intake area and your local intake area changes to Inner City College you will have the choice to enrol your children at your current local intake school or Inner City College.

### Semester Reports

Teachers are currently working on semester reports for Pre-primary to Year 6 and portfolios for Kindergarten students. Semester reports will be emailed to parents on Friday. A test email will be sent today to the family mail marker contact email address on the School Information System, to notify parents that this is the email address receiving the report on Friday. We will also be tracking emails to ensure parents have opened this link by Monday, otherwise we will be printing your child's report on Tuesday to ensure you receive the report in the last week of term. Families who normally require two copies of reports will have one posted to the address indicated to the administration.

Kindergarten students will be taking home their portfolios at the same time. Parents are asked to comment in these and return them in the first week of term 3.

For this semester, reports in English, Maths, Science, History and Geography, Health and Physical Education will be reported against the standards of the Western Australian Curriculum, along with Languages and the Arts. When reporting in these learning areas, teachers are required to make a judgement about whether a student is meeting the achievement standard in their year level. If they are deemed to be meeting the standard they will receive a C grade which demonstrates satisfactory performance. To achieve a B or an A, they will have to be demonstrating high or excellent achievement.

Parents, please note that the subjects of Design and Technologies and Digital Technologies are in a familiarisation phase. This means teachers are introducing new content which will allow students time to become confident and equipped to master the necessary skills, concepts and understandings to successfully engage in the learning area. For this reason, students will not be assessed in either area until full implementation is required by the School Curriculum and Standards Authority in 2018.

For Pre-primary and Years 1 and 2 there are no letter grades applied to the level of achievement. Descriptors of excellent, high, satisfactory, limited and very low are used to describe achievement. Attitude, effort and behaviour is shown on reports for all years using the scale: Consistently, Often, Sometimes and Seldom.

**As a special request, we ask parents to archive and save their child's reports for future retrieval.**

**Please note that the link to open the reports expires after four weeks.**

Please take the time to sit down with your child and discuss their achievements and celebrate their learning.

Thank you to students, staff and parents for making me feel so welcome at Inglewood Primary and I have had a wonderful term getting to know our students and school community.

## 2018 KINDERGARTEN APPLICATIONS 19 JUNE TO 21 JULY 2017

Inglewood Primary School is a local intake school and under the enrolment policy guidelines children whose place of residence is within the local area for six months into the academic year can complete an application form for enrolment. We are taking these applications from **19 June until the 21 July 2017**. If you choose to submit an application prior to these dates you will be asked to return with current information before your application can go to the next step. If you live outside our boundaries we recommend that you apply for your local school as in recent years we have not been able to offer places to students out of area. Department policy stipulates that you can only apply at one school, so we would not like you to apply here and miss out on a place at your local school.

## 2018 PRE-PRIMARY APPLICATIONS 19 JUNE TO 30 JUNE

We will be taking applications from our current kindergarten students into pre-primary during the week, Monday 19 June until Friday 23 June, between 8.30am and 3.30pm. Individual packages will be mailed to parents before this date. All local intake area rules apply as per the above information provided to Kindy parents. If you live outside our local intake area in 2017 you are not guaranteed enrolment. All parents will be notified of the outcome of their application in mid August 2017.

## SCHOOL PHOTOS

School Photo day is approaching! Fotomakers WA will be visiting Inglewood Primary School on 19, 20 and 21 July 2017 (Year 1 to 6: 19 July, Kindergarten: 20 and 21, Pre-Primary: 20 July 2017). Every student will receive an envelope. Their name and other individual information (ie. Unique shoot key for online ordering) is printed on each personalised envelope. Parents are asked to complete the envelope by marking the order they require and enclosing their payment choice (either cash or cheque inside the envelope or if ordering on line clearly showing the online receipt number on the front of the envelope).



Every student must return their envelope on photo day with their order clearly marked, even where payment is made in one envelope for multiple siblings. See your envelope for more information.

ALL students will be photographed individually on photography day for school administration records. A second chance to purchase photos will be offered once delivery is made of all initial orders. The school will be offering a sibling photo service during your photography day. If you would like to have a sibling photo taken please collect a 'sibling envelope' from the office.

## RECYCLING

This semester, we have recycled 5.4 kg of coffee pods and 9.9kg of batteries. These materials have been sent to recycling centres so that they be recycled and removed from landfill.

Why recycle batteries? Australians use thousands of tonnes of batteries every year, most of which end up in landfill where the metals can leak and contaminate soil and groundwater. ## FRIENDLY SCHOOLS<sup>PLUS</sup> Evidence for Practice

### Communicating effectively with your children

It is important to discuss bullying with your children on a regular basis. Regular communication with a person they trust and respect will help them form their own opinions and beliefs about bullying. Your children will also feel more comfortable telling you if they are being bullied.

Consider trying some of these ideas to improve the way you talk with your children about tricky issues.

#### Sit shoulder-to-shoulder or walk with your child as you talk

Talking face-to-face can be quite confrontational, particularly for boys. Sitting or walking side by side will encourage both you and your child to talk freely.

#### Use open-ended questions

It is easy to ask your child if they had a good day or if they would like toast for breakfast; however these questions only require a yes or no answer.

Try asking questions such as "What did you do today?" or "What would you like for breakfast?" These types of questions encourage discussion between you and your child.

#### Talk with your children about what to do rather than what not to do

It is common for us to focus on negative behaviour, such as "don't step in that puddle" or "stop swinging on your chair".

Try telling your children what you would like them to do rather than what you don't want them to do.

You can do this by using positive statements such as "please step over the puddle" or "please put the chair legs on the floor".
